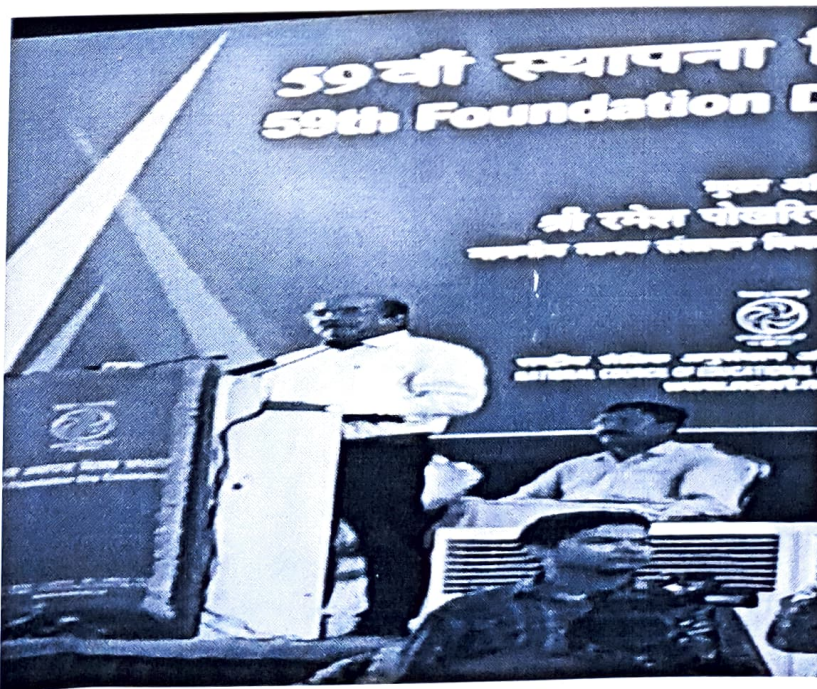
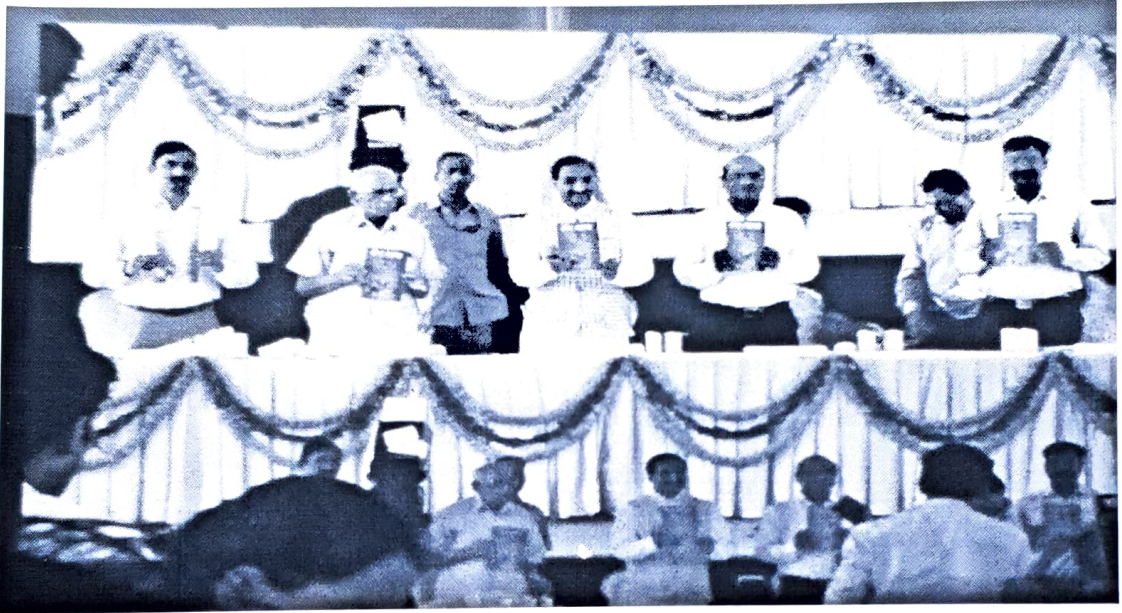




NCERT FOUNDATIONS DAY CELEBRATION

This day at IVC was celebrated with great zeal and enthusiasm, result of which were n no. of co-curricular activities hosted by students for their beautiful teachers.

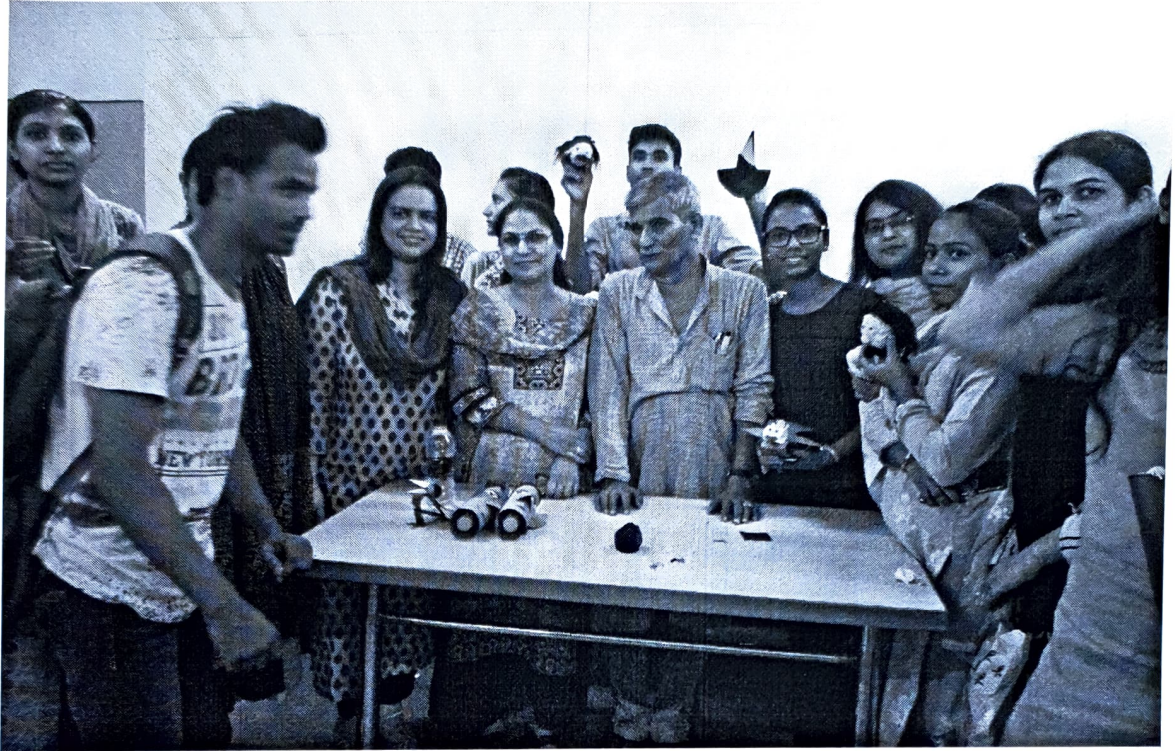
The main objective of this whole celebration was to show the teachers how much loved and respected they are for the service they do to their students.



PUPPETRY WORKSHOP

A puppet making workshop was organised for the students of Institute of Vocational Studies on 6 September, 2019. This workshop aimed at introducing the various techniques of puppet making. Resource person Mr. Pramod Kr. Sharma from **NCERT** led the workshop. He told the students about the art of puppetry and how it could be integrated in the teaching process to generate curiosity among the learners, thereby making the teaching learning process more engaging and interesting. He showed how puppetry can be incorporated in the story telling activity to enrich the learning process. He taught a variety of methods to make puppets, ranging from simple paper folding techniques to cloth sewing and stitching methods. World of puppets was showcased by the display of different types of puppets which included Finger puppets, hand puppet/ glove puppet and shadow puppet. Different tricks that have to be kept in mind while making a puppet, such as stress should be laid upon the '**optical distance**' rather than the '**mechanical distance**' were told. Simple and no fuss methods could be inculcated to make puppets more attractive e.g. a simple cloth could be attached beneath a bottle puppet which would appear as its dress. The students participated with full enthusiasm and displayed their immaculate work by making colourful and attractive puppets. They used a variety of materials like coloured paper, cloth and recycled medium. The puppet making workshop proved to be a true learning experience for all the participants.







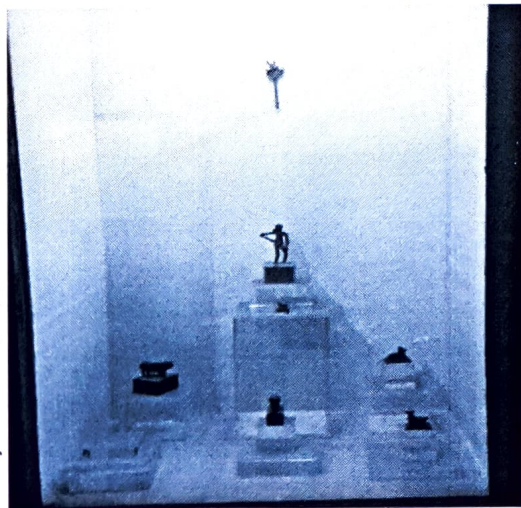
National Eye Donation Day

VISIT TO THE NATIONAL MUSEUM

A trip to the National Museum, Delhi was scheduled for the students of D .El. Ed and B. Ed on 11th and 12th of September respectively by the Institute of Vocational Studies. There was a wave of excitement and curiosity in the students. National Museum showcases the extensive works of art and culture from the past. It is among the largest museums in India. The museum provides an insight in India's history and the achievements and innovations in terms of art, culture and other fields of development. We first visited the ground floor which include items from Harappan civilization and Indus valley civilization. A special mention for the famous dancing girl of

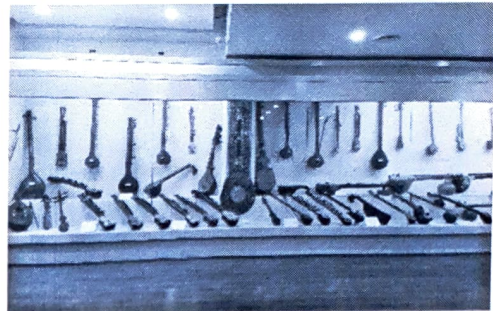


Harappa. She is just about 4 inches in height. The main highlights are the terracotta toys, funeral mount and even a skeleton of a woman from Indus Valley civilization. Other pieces that are displayed here are those portraying Gupta Art, Buddhist Art, Indian miniature paintings, Indian scripts and decorative arts. The floor also has a library and an auditorium. Special exhibitions are held at first floor. The other collections displayed here include Manuscripts, Central Asian antiquities, Ajanta paintings and

Thanjavur paintings. The museum has the biggest collection of miniature paintings from across the country. Miniature painting gallery at the museum is the best place to admire and appreciate this art form. The creative use of small space to depict a lot is what we can learn from these paintings. The second floor has a large collection of costumes and textiles from the historical times of India. There is an elaborate collection of coins belonging to different periods of history i.e. the British period, the Mughal period. The fabric pieces are so immaculately

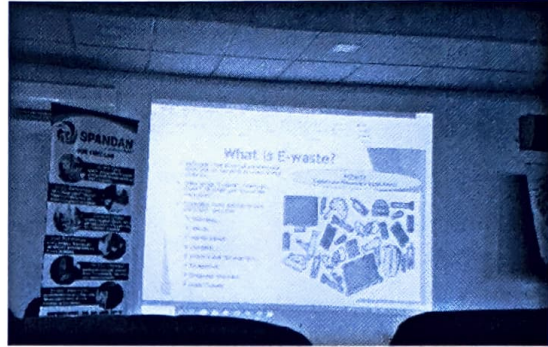
and beautifully designed. A special section is dedicated to house the amazing musical instruments from different eras. It clearly depicts the strong association of music with our culture.

The students learned so many things about the rich Indian culture. It proved to be a great learning experience for all of us. We got to know so much about the culture and traditions of the previous times and also realised that it is our responsibility to keep the essence of Indian culture alive by staying connected to our roots.



Swachhata Pakhwada 2019

An awareness campaign was organised by an NGO named 'Spandan' on 13 September in Institute of Vocational Studies. The campaign focussed on creating awareness among the budding teachers about the detrimental effects of E-waste and what possible measures could be taken for the safe disposal of the same. 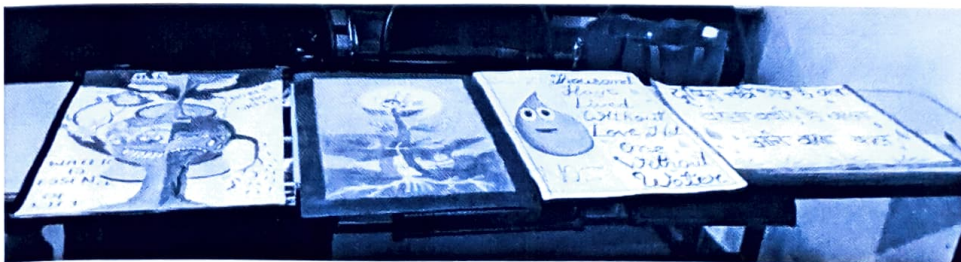

largest generator of E-waste which proved to be the major cause of concern. The NGO also showed some documentaries depicting the plight of the people indulged in the

informal sector of E-waste disposal. They were totally unaware of the hazardous effects of the E-waste that they were dealing with. The



NGO also

highlighted the fact that it's high time that we as responsible citizens

of India should dispose our E waste timely and consciously. They also encouraged the pupil teachers to inculcate ways to raise awareness about environmental sustainability in their students. At the end of the workshop, the students were asked to give their feedback regarding E-waste management. The workshop proved to be great learning experience for the students. This was followed by poster and slogan making activity by the respective houses on 'water conservation'.

Also students of D.el.ed staged a Nukkad Natak in the Sheik Sarai Authority premises on the ongoing campaign of "Swachhta Pakhwada 2019"

Students presented a powerful performance on the topic "Jal Shakti Abhiyan" and "Say No to Plastic" by providing message of how to minimise the use and consumption of water and save water through



water harvesting plants.

They also stressed on to make people aware about the harmful effects of using plastic and making India free from single use of plastics.

The workshop was interesting and informative, as it focuses on training of the mind and dealing with situations.



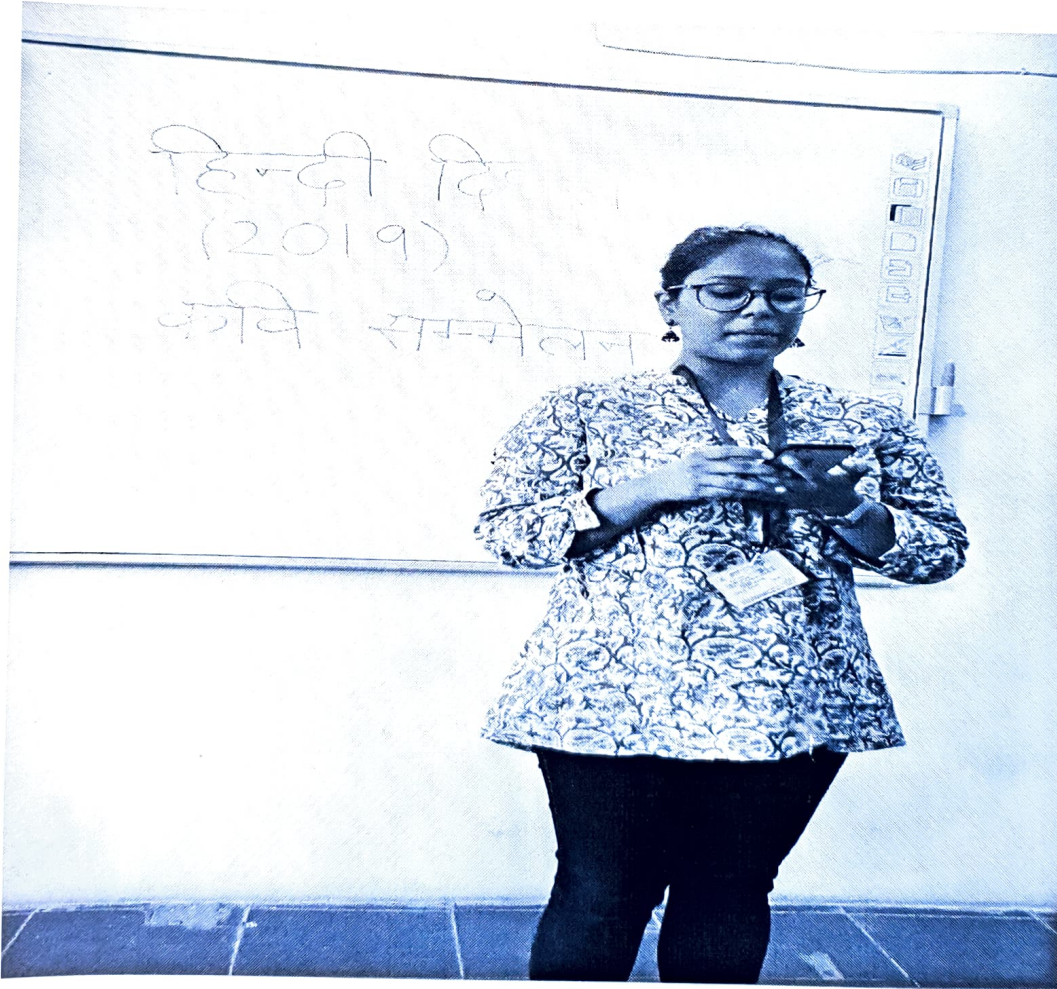
Hindi Pakhwada: Hindi Kavi Sammelan, 2019

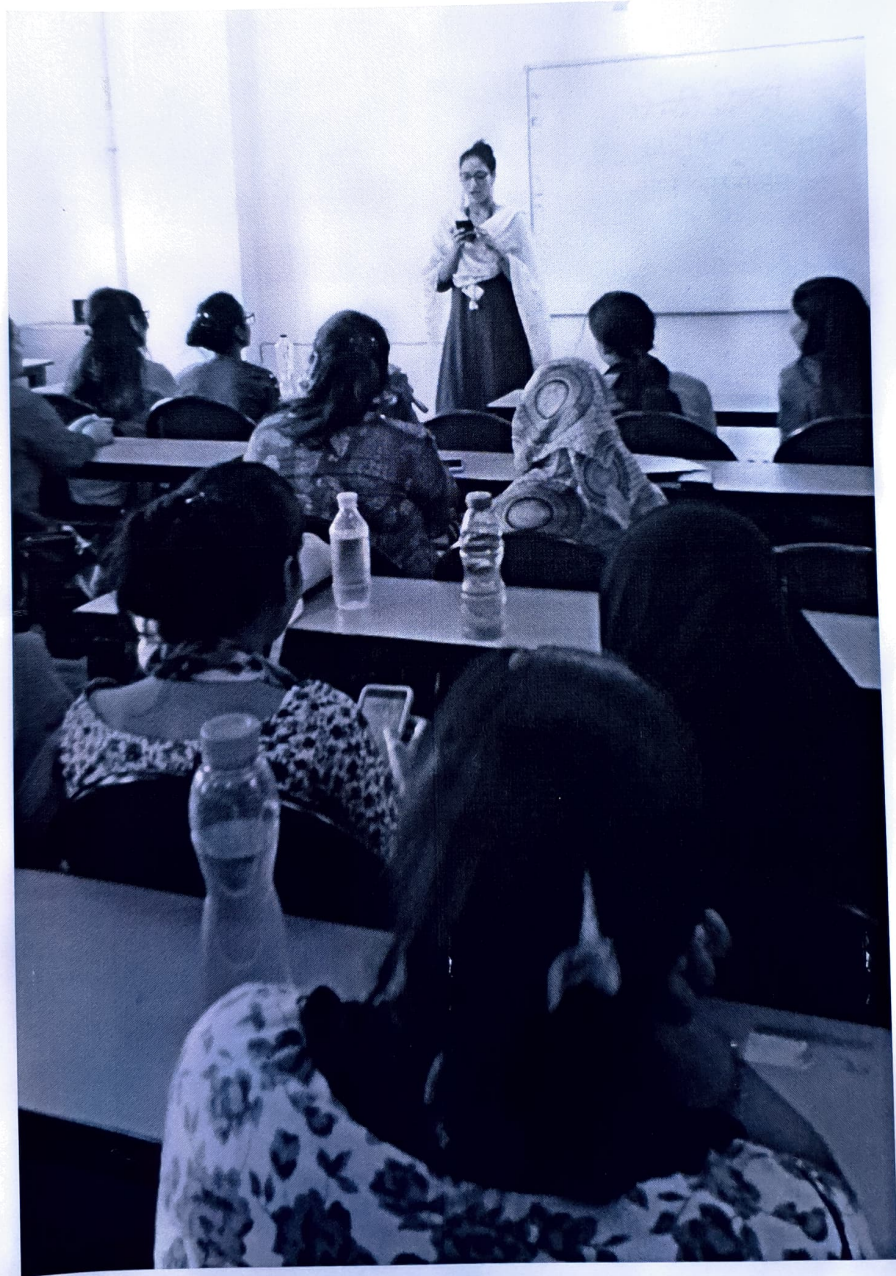

A theatre workshop was organised at Institute of Vocational studies for the students of B. Ed and D. El. Ed. A resource person Mr. Vashishth Upadhyay conducted it. The students were introduced to the magnificent world of theatre. It covered different



aspects of acting ranging from movement, voice, improvisation and stage knowledge. The roots of art, music and dance can be traced back to the era of early man. The early man learnt to express his innate creativity by painting on



cave walls and produced music by listening to natural sounds and repeating them. Mr. Upadhyay explained how theatre could be used as a means not only in terms of exploring the unexplored or hidden ability to act but also by shedding the inhibitions associated with performing in front of an audience. The teacher told us about a range of significant details which

can be kept in mind while we are performing on stage, for example, one should walk tall with head held high, shoulders back and a smile across one's face, one should always make an eye contact during a conversation. Interestingly, all these tips can be incorporated in real life situations too which would help us grow as a confident individual. The aspiring teachers were equipped with the tools of dramatic expression which can be used



to enhance the teaching- learning process e .g, if the students have to be taught



about the characteristics of a desert, they can be asked to imagine the peculiar features of a desert and enact it in their favourite icon's way. This would generate interest among them, make them focus on the topic better and would nurture and

utilize their creative abilities to the utmost. Students were given creative freedom to improvise and come up with own stories. Every student participated in the given tasks with great zeal and enthusiasm. All the students found the experience novel and immensely engaging.
