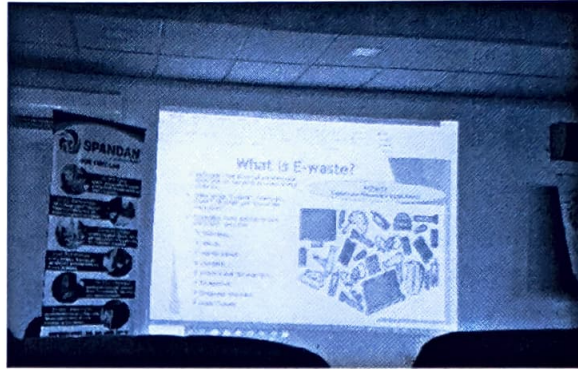


Swachhata Pakhwada 2019

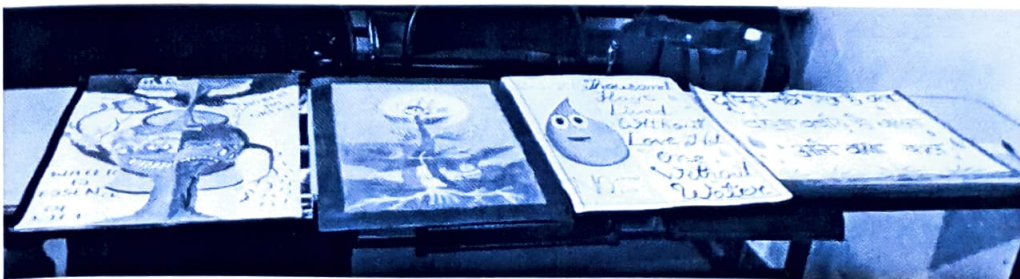
